



They used to say too that Africa is very hot. To say I have not experienced much the heat and the cold of all these years I have lived in the mission.

My Experience in the Mission of Mongolia

Coming to the land of Ghinggis Khan made me to wonder what life was going to be and my two years and a half of missionary life was full of wonder and surprises. On 30 October in 2014 I left for South Korea the headquarter of Mongolia and after 5 months of waiting in South Korea for the visa, I finally set foot on this beloved land of God on 24 March 2015. The mission in Mongolia officially started in 2007 but before the Institution of the community, Sr. Teresa Soo Kyung Choi from South Korea and Sr. Imelda David from Philippines (sent by Mother General) came to Mongolia in 2006 to learn the language and then other two sisters Sr. Maria Domenica Pak Hye Ja and Sr. Maria Domenica Chang joined them in 2007 and formed the International community in Mongolia. The mission was opened as a sign of gratitude to God for the 50 years of the presence of the FMAs in South Korea and the blessings they received from God. Hence, they wanted to expand the mission to another country and be able to serve

the kids and the young people in the spirit of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello. Rev. Bishop Wenceslao Padilla the Apostolic Prefecture of Mongolia welcomed our sisters in Mongolia and handed the School of the Diocese to our sisters. So here we are from three Nationalities: Sr. Cecilia Choi as the Animator, Sr. Maria Domenica Pak Hye Ja and Sr. Domenica Chang from South Korea. We have Sr. Hanako Kojima from Japan and from India, Sr. Agness Gangmei belonging to Guwahati Province and me from Shillong Province. The first year of my life here was to learn the Mongolian language in the classroom of the Prefecture with the new missionaries of other Congregations and in the afternoon I was with the little kids in the Kindergarten and Elementary school till grade 1 and side by side with seeing to the cleanliness of the house and for cooking we took turns. At the beginning we were staying in the school occupying the classrooms for some time till the building for the Sisters was completed. The school





belongs to the Diocese and our Sisters manage the school with the manager and the staff. The children who come to our school are mainly from a very poor background and the Institution is helping these kids to carry on in their studies.

In October 2015, I was sent to Mornese community in Darkhan 4 hours journey from the city of Ulaanbaatar. Here I attended the Mongolian class and worked in the Salesian Parish as a Sacristan, looking after the Church and in-charge of the “Come and See” group of the Parish and the Oratory in Don Bosco Centre that was functioning everyday. My beautiful life in Darkhan was cut short due to the mishap that took place on 13 February 2016 in which our house caught fire early in the morning due to the electricity short circuit. It was a great lost for us but providence never failed us. We saw the solidarity of our Salesian Fathers and our Catholics who came to help us to put things right. We shifted to the Sdb’s house for some months and on 12 January 2017, we moved to Auxilium Orbit in Ulaanbaatar with all our belongings where the new House was just inaugurated and for a moment we have to close down the community in Darkhan not knowing when will be the right moment for us to

start again our mission. We wait for God’s own time.

Here in Auxilium Orbit, we live in the periphery of the city of Ulaanbaatar amidst the poor people even though some Chinese apartments are coming up but the majority of the people are poor and we are the only Catholics here. We are just close to the protestant church that is behind our house so much so the Government officials thought that our convent is a church and therefore permission for the opening of our Library and other activities took a little bit of time. Our Sisters made the officials understand that our house is meant for the education of the children and young people of the area and only after that we got the permission to start our activities according to the Spirit of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello. At the start of our Apostolate, all of us here felt that we are re-living the dream of Don Bosco when he was just nine years old ... oh really, the first day itself they took away our balls, skipping ropes, rings and most of the books and our library was almost empty. As days go by things seems to change for the better. They come willingly to our center to read books, do their homework and study their lessons and discipline themselves in games. They love to play and is hard to send them home so we allow them to play till 9.00 pm or sometimes it goes to 10.00 pm. So, the gate is always open otherwise they climb over the gate or fences too they do not mind provided they are in the campus. Sr. Agnes Gangmei is in-charge of the Library and Sr. Hanako Kojima in the Oratory and the other Sisters take turn for Assistance. For the moment I am sent to the school to give a helping hand to Sr. Maria Domenica Chang and so in the afternoon I go to teach English for the elementary students

of Grade 1 to 3 though a missionary is not allowed to teach but had to hire only Mongolians for the work. On Sundays, I go to Shuvvu the Salesian Parish for Holy Mass and teach Catechism for the small ones and young people alternatively along with the lay Catechists. I am happy to serve the mission even with my little contribution that I can offer in the community and in my apostolate with the kids, the young and the people entrusted to our care.

I thank God for the gift of Life as a missionary though it is not that easy. The call of Abraham always had an impact on me ... Leave your country and your people ... Reading and living is a different thing altogether. I had a little fear in me as I travelled to the land which would be my land, my home, my people, my culture my environment and spheres of life in the midst of snow for 9 months, no green trees, hills are so bare except for a few of them and only for 3 months we could enjoy Sunlight. God is so good for during these 3 months the crops grow very fast like potatoes, carrots, cabbage, salad and the wheat gets ripe very fast. God is such a loving Father that knows the needs of His people. Even the skin of the Mongolian people is very thick so that they could resist the cold during winter which goes up to -47 degree. The same with the cattle and animals they too are having thick skin to protect themselves from the biting cold of winter. The people of Mongolia recognize the four seasons in a year but for me I experience only two

seasons in a year i.e. Winter and summer. Regarding Religion many centuries ago Buddhism and Shamanism have become the people's religion and very few people know about Jesus Christ though the protestant sects came before the Catholic Church and now the Catholic Church is celebrating 25 years of its presence here with the gift of the first Mongolian Priest ordained last year in 2016. The people are confused between Catholic Church and Protestant Church and so they thought it is the same. Meanwhile in our school we cannot speak about Jesus Christ nor teach religion not even allowed to put our Crucifix and Religious dress because they said your dress speaks volumes of Religion the only place we can teach religion is in the Church.


Though there is peace and tranquility in the country, yet we missionaries face difficulties in another way, no shedding blood as in other countries but some kind of suffering is there always. We are not sure when the Government will tell us to leave the country and so we were told that our life as a missionary is only temporary and we need to form the local Church and allow them to grow. 25 years have gone by



but we feel that the Church is just at the beginning of its life. Only 1300 and more Catholics in the whole of Mongolia so you could imagine we are so few here but we are not forgotten by God. He loves this country and we wait in His own time for salvation to come to our people with your prayerful support.

Thank you from the depths of my heart for remembering me and all the Missionaries in your prayers

Conclusion of the Marian Month



In the goodnight talk besides reminding the girls of the exhortation of Mother, she recalled to them how the Sisters from Europe had come to Jowai 91 years ago and made them understand that it is time now to go out and be heralds of the message of joy.

District Level Science Exhibition

The District Secondary Education Officer of East Jaintia Hills District, Mrs. Gracely Pde organized a two-day Science Exhibition at the District Level on the 25-26 April 2017 at Khliehriat Secondary School on the theme: “Mathematics and Science in Everyday life”.

Based on the theme there were five sub-themes in which all the schools that participated in the competition were allowed to select two sub-themes. 


