FMA INDIA CONCLUDING THE CELEBRATION **OF 100 GLORIOUS YEARS**

n eventful and historic occasion, the closing ceremony of the centenary celebration of the FMA presence in India, was held at Auxilium Shillong on 10 September 2023. The holy eucharist was presided over by Most Rev. Victor Lyngdoh of Shillong Archdiocese and conclebrated by Bishop Lumen Monteiro of Tripura Diocese, Bishop Jose Chirackal, the Auxiliary Bishop of Tura Diocese, and 30 concelebrants.

India, the Digital Archive of the Province, the Education Guidelines for the Province, a collection of success stories of over 100 past pupils entitled From Foundations to Heights, felicitations of centenary committees, and above all, a short opera, A Tribute of Love, which showcased the journey and history of the six pioneers in Northeast India. The opera did justice to celebrate the mission, the sacrifice, the joy, and the faith of the pioneers.



At the outset of the Holy Eucharist, Mother Chiara Cazzuola carried a picture of the six pioneers placed on a boat bearing the centenary flag, and Sr. Elizabeth George, Provincial of Shillong, brought a lighted lamp. It symbolises the Sisters' readiness to carry forth the light of the charism for generations to come. In his homily, the archbishop thanked God for the 100 years of the presence of the FMA and described the six Pioneers as women of faith, women of prayer, women of action, women who lived out their lives, bringing others to see and know the face and the love of the Lord Jesus. He thanked all the FMA members for touching countless lives in their mission among the young people. Further, he exhorted the Sisters that the centenary celebration is a call to continue to be agents of God's love and compassion and to ensure that the mission continues and bears fruit for generations to come.

The afternoon programme consisted of the

The chief guest for the occasion was the Superior General of the FMA, Mother Chiara Cazzuola; guest of honour, Mrs. Mazel Ampareen Lyngdoh, Cabinet minister of the state of Meghalaya; three general councillors from Rome; seven provincials of India; two of the CIAO; government officials; civil authorities; Sisters; invitees; Salesian cooperators; past pupils; and over 700 young people. In her message to the huge gathering, Mother General expressed her joy of celebrating in the centenary festivities. She paid tribute to the pioneers who had spent their whole life giving and serving the people. She thanked everyone for the warm and affectionate welcome and said that she felt at home in their midst. Together with Don Bosco, Mother Chiara recognised Mary's presence and concluded saying, "To Mary we entrust the Province. We are confident that She will continue to pray for us and the province".





On the previous day, 9
September 2023, a National
Youth Meet commenced
at Auxilium Girls' Higher
Secondary School,
Nongthymmai. Participating
in the event were the youth
representatives from the

seven Indian provinces, numbering over 700. The chief guest for the celebration was Mother Chiara Cazzuola, and the guests of honour were Smt. Isawanda Laloo, Director of Sports and Youth Affairs, Government of Meghalaya, and Smt. Rosetta Mary Kurbah, Deputy Commissioner of East Khasi Hills, District of Meghalaya.

The ceremonial lighting of the lamp, the release of six doves, and the centenary flag hoisting marked the inaugural function and gave a fitting start to the days' events. In her message to the gathering, Mother Chiara, emphasising the message of World Youth Day 2023, invited the young people to be helpers like Mother Mary and be ready to help those in need, especially the neglected ones.

Smt. Isawanda Laloo lauded the works of the Salesian Sisters during the past century, particularly in the fields of education and social upliftment. In her capacity as Director of Sports and Youth Affairs for the Government of Meghalaya, she renewed her commitment to equal roles and opportunities for girls and women with like-minded organisations such as

Lyngkot, Salesian Provincial of Shillong Province, and con-celebrated by 21 other priests. The Choral




Evangelists from Mawlai made the celebration devout and meaningful through their melodious voices. At the entrance

procession, three flags were brought to the altar, namely, the Institute Flag, the Centenary Flag, and the AYM Flag, inviting everyone to enter into the celebration with a deep sense of gratitude.

In his homily, Fr. Paul emphasised Mother Mary's presence in Northeast India, even before the Salesians. He invited everyone to take her as a role model and guide in every endeavour. In the midst of the varied challenges of life, he encouraged the youth to turn to her through prayers, especially praying the Rosary. In turn, he exhorted them to be generous in their services and to imitate her purity and chastity. The celebration of the Holy Eucharist was an opportunity to recall the great mission initiated by the six pioneers.

The youth were engaged in lively competitions like panel discussions, role play, and personalisation

of the qualities of the Good Shepherd. They also paid homage to the pioneers with a presentation from the seven provinces through a colourful cultural display. Besides these, the youth were animated in an hour of God experience led by Mr. Kupar Shadap from the Youth United for Christ During the two-day



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Homily on the occasion of the Centenary Celebrations of the FMA in North East India

his morning we come together to Rejoice, to Celebrate, to Give Thanks. To rejoice and celebrate that we are members of God's Family, the God who loves us, the God who calls us, the God who walks with us on a journey, each and every day. The God who revealed himself to us in the person of Jesus, his Son.

The God who is active in the world today, through the ministry of the church, the church to which we all belong, the church in which each day, we are called to live out our calling to be Sons and Daughters, Brothers and Sisters, making the presence of the Lord known in the world by what we do, by who we are, by our actions, by our prayer.

This morning we recall in a special way, six women of Faith, women of Prayer, women of Action, women who lived out their lives, bringing others to see and know the face and the love of the Lord Jesus. Women who lived in another time but who are still very much today - women of our time.

The six pioneers, Sr Innocenza Vallino, Sr. Clotilde Appiano, Sr Giulia Berra, Sr Rosetti Antonietta, Sr Cecilia Da Roit and Sr. Maria Bricarello who are 'filled by the Holy Spirit' obeyed the command of the congregation and like Jesus in today's Gospel they came to our land "to preach good news to the poor. For it was Christ through the congregation who has sent them to proclaim release to the captives, recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord." (cfr Lk 4:16-19)

Who would have thought that these six woman, unfamiliar with our culture, traditions and languages 100 years ago would have such an impact on region and the church in particular. But this was all part of God's plan for them, for the Salesian Sisters Congregation, for the Church and for the benefit of our people. This was all part of God's mission for them.

As we read their lives story, all the six sisters were persons of deep faith, a faith that was nurtured by their families and later by the Salesian Congregation, their family that encouraged



them in their prayer life, instilled in them the values of hard work and a sense of leadership and responsibility. All of them joined the congregation and began to work in various capacities and responsibilities. And today as we celebrate this Centenary, we sing with joy, we make joyful noise for the hundred years of blessings God has blessed us through these missionaries.

We gather here to celebrate a momentous occasion, a centenary that marks not just the passing of time, but also a century of dedication, service, and faithfulness. We commemorate the 100th anniversary of those who tirelessly served the Church and the world.





Visit of Mother Chiara Cazzuola Superior General, to Shillong Province (INS)

he joyous occasion of the conclusion of the centenary celebration in India brought the 10th successor of St. Mary Domenica Mazzarello, Mother Chiara Cazzuola, to the Immaculate Heart of Mary Province of Shillong on 8 September 2023. Along with her were Sr. Runita Galve Borja, Councillor for Youth Ministry; Sr. Nilza Fátima de Moraes, Councillor for Formation; and Sr. Celine Jacob, Visiting Councillor.

was accorded a state guest welcome by the Governor of Meghalaya State and was received by the security personnel and the Sisters at Lokapriya Gopinath International Airport in Guwahati.

On their way to Shillong, the first to receive the revered guests were the Sisters and Aspirants at Auxilium Training Centre, Saiden, joined by





the nearby community of Auxilium Mawtnum. On arriving at Auxilium Campus Shillong,

Mother Chiara Cazzuola and the General Councillors—Sr. Runita Galve Borja, Sr. Nilza Fátima de Moraes, and Sr. Celine Jacob, Visiting Councillor—received a traditional and family welcome. Escorted by the NCC Cadets, the dancers, and the Auxilium School band, they were led to the provincial house in the presence of many Sisters, young people, and past pupils. The young people adorned with the traditional attire waved their Salesian colour flags of blue and pink as a mark of joyful welcome. At the entrance of the Auxilium community, a short felicitation was conducted by Ms. Elena Kharkongor, a teacher and past pupil, and all were presented with a bouquet of flowers, symbols of love and appreciation, and a sign of welcome. To the tune of the song, There shall be showers of blessings, the Auxilium school band led the welcome procession to the new provincial house. Mother Chiara was donned in a khasi traditional dress, and the felicitations of the councillors, the provincials of FMA India, and the two provincials of CIAO, Sr. Alma Castagna, provincial of Timor and CIAO Président, and Sr. Gertrude Ched, provincial of Myanmar and Cambodia, followed.

An official word of welcome was conveyed by Sr. Elizabeth George, the provincial, to Mother Chiara. She in turn



reciprocated the gestures of love and filial expression of the Sisters by saying thank you in the language of the place, Khasi, Khublei Shibun. Mother told the assembly that she loves everyone and was glad to witness the Salesian joy and

cheer. After the grand welcome, the Sisters proceeded to the chapel for a short prayer of thanksgiving. Recalling the Salesian charism that was planted 100 years ago and that has taken

root and is flourishing in the region, in a prayer led by Sr. Rosina Susngi, Mother Chiara offered a green plant as a symbolic gesture, offering the future of the congregation in this part of the world to the

next hundred vears, which not only belong to the provinces in the nation but to the congregation at large.


On 9 September

On that day, Mother encountered the Salesian cooperators and past pupils, who form part of the family. Mr. Anthony Laloo, coordinator of the Association of Salesian Cooperators of Shillong Province, shared briefly the activities of the members in the province. Past pupils, Dr. Valencia Marboh and

Mrs. Marylinda Sun shared the impact of Salesian education on their lives and personalities.



During their stay in Shillong, from 9 to 12 September, Mother General met the Provincial Councillors, Animators, perpetually professed Sisters in four groups, the temporary professed

In the evening, back at the provincial house, a thanksgiving prayer and adoration was organised for the gifts of Mother General Chiara Cazzuola, Sr. Nilza Fatima Moraes, Councillor for Formation, and Sr. Runita Borja, Councillor for Youth Ministry. A seashell was offered at the altar by Mother Chiara, as a symbol of the

On 13 September 2023, enroute to Guwahati, Mother Chiara Cazzuola and the General Councillors visited the Cathedral of






